However, it does include operating expenses, management fees, including 12b-1 fees, and administrative fees.

Total Investment Expense - Net; you will be responsible for this expense and it will be automatically taken prior to calculating performance. Total Investment Expense -Net is the Total Investment Expense - Gross expense ratio less any fee waivers, reimbursements or caps, if applicable. The expenses ratio, as a percentage of net assets, includes operating expenses, management fees, including 12b-1 fees, and administrative fees.

Expense Waiver/Contractual Cap - When gross and net expense ratios differ, the investment adviser may have agreed to waive certain expenses that would normally be payable by the fund or contractually agreed to limit the investment option's expenses.

Some or all of the Plan administrative expenses are paid from the total investment expense of one or more of the Plan's investment options.
